Glazed Lemon Flute Cake (fm Taste of Home)

1 bx yellow cake mix (regular size)

1 bx 3 oz lemon gelatin

4 eggs

2/3 cup water

2/3 cup canola oil

Glaze

1 cup confectioner's sugar

3 tbsp lemon juice

1 tsp grated fresh lemon peel

In a large bowl, combine the cake mix, gelatin, eggs, water and oil. Beat on low speed for 1 minute; then beat on medium speed for 2 minutes.

Pour into a greased and floured 10 inch fluted tube pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 38-42 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool for 10 minutes before removing from pan to a wire rack. Place on serving plate.

Combine glaze ingredients, drizzled over warm cake. Cool completely before cutting. Yield: 10-12 servings.


