A PARS

3 lb meat (pork butt, cut into large chunks, short ribs, or chicken)

1 cn (8 oz) tomato sauce

1 cn sugar (use tomato sauce can)

1 cn shoyu (use tomato sauce can)

3 cloves garlic, crushed
1 inch piece fresh ginger, crushed

salt and pepper to season whiskey to taste (optional)

Pour tomato sauce in a pot. Fill can with sugar and add to the pot. Fill can with shoyu and add to the pot. Add remaining ingredients of garlic, ginger, salt, pepper and whiskey. Place meat in sauce and cook, coered, on low to moderate heat for about 40 to 60 minutes, or until tender.

Yield: 6 - 8 servings.

Dr. Koon-Hui Wang, Associate Professor and Chair, Dept. of Plant and Environmental Protection Sciences (PEPS), at the University of Hawaii Manoa will speak on "Pest Management for Hobby Orchid Gardeners" with a focus on insectary plants. What are insectary plants? you ask. Well insectary plants are those that attract insects to control thrips, spider mites, and other orchid pests through biological pest control rather than insecticides. Insectary plants increase the abundance and effectiveness of natural enemies that help suppress pest populations.

Dr. Wang received a PhD in Plant Pathology, an M.S. in Horticulture and a B.S. in Horticulture. She is a noted authority in her field, has published numerous articles and books, teaches at UH Manoa and conducts research.
