

1 medium head cauliflower (about 2 lbs), florets & stem cut into 1" pieces

1 garlic clove, peeled

1/4 cup olive oil, divided, plus more for serving

1 med onion, thinly sliced

1 tsp ground cumin

2 tsp kosher salt, divided

3/4 cup plain Greek vogurt

1 tsp finely grated lemon zest 3 tbsp fresh lemon juice coarsely chopped parsley (for serving)

Baby romaine hearts and endive

leaves (for serving)

Pour water into medium saucepan to depth of 1/4"; add cauliflower and garlic. Cover, bring to boil over high heat, & cook til florets are very easily pierced with paring knife, about 10 minutes. Drain and set aside.

Meanwhile, heat 2 thsp oil in large skillet over medium. Add onion, cumin, and 1 tsp salt and cook, stirring often, until onion is translucent, about 3 minutes. Increase heat to medium high and cook, stirring often, til onion is golden brown, about 5 minutes. Transfer onion mixture to blender. Add yogurt, lemon zest and juice, reserved cauliflower, & remaining 1 tsp salt and puree til smooth. With motor running, add 2 thsp oil in a steady stream until well combined. If too thick, blend in 1 thsp water at a time to reach desired consistency. Let cool to room temperature. To serve, spread dip in side bowl or platter. Drizzle with oil and top with parslet. Serve with romaine hears and endive leaves along side

for dipping. Dip can be made 5 days ahead; cover and chill. Makes about 4 cups
