

4 pieces butterfish
1/4 cup white miso
1 tsp ginger, grated
1/4 cup beer or sake (opt)
1/4 cup sugar
1/4 cup soy sauce
1 clove garlic, grated

Rinse butterfish and dry with paper towel. Blend the sauce ingredients; marinate the butterfish for a few hours. Heat a little oil in a skillet and fry the butterfish on low heat. Any leftover sauce can be heated and poured over the butterfish before serving.
