

2 cans Comstock Apple (or Cherry) filling

3 blocks butter

4 cups flour

1 1/4 cup sugar

Mix flour and sugar. Mix butter with dry ingredients until it comes to a crumb texture, using a pastry cutter. Use 3/4 of crumb mixture to make the crust (bottom) and press firmly into a 9×13 -inch pan. Spread the filling evenly on bottom crust. Place the remainder of crumb mixture on top of fruit filling.

Bake 1 hour at 350 degrees F., or until top crust is a golden brown.

<u>DISPLAY SET UP AND BREAKDOWN.</u> Display set up date is Thursday, October 10, 2019 starting at 9:00 am. We need to see you at the show with your groomed and blooming plants. <u>PLANT REGISTRATION</u> is Thursday, October 10, 2019 from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. Members <u>bring your blooming plants in and register them by 10:30 am but NLT 11:00 am.</u> (Varietal name and all merit awards must be included on the registration form) to allow us ample time to <u>complete the set up by 3 pm</u> even though the orchid display completion time is 4:00 pm.
