

Pineapple Upside-Down Muffin Cakes

A friend submitted this recipe to a cookbook our school district was compiling. The first time I made them, the whole family declared the recipe a winner. Delicious and healthy to boot, they remain favorites to this day.

Ingredients:

1/3 cup packed brown sugar or 3 tbsp brown sugar substitute blend

2 tbsp butter, melted

3 each canned pineapple slices

Cake Ingredients:

1/3 cup butter, softened1 tsp baking powder½ cup sugar¼ tsp baking soda

1 large egg ½ tsp salt

½ tsp vanilla extract ½ cup fat-free lemon or vanilla Greek yogurt

1 cup all-purpose flour ½ cup fat-free milk

Directions:

Preheat over to 350 degrees F. Coat 12 regular size muffin cups with cooking spray. Mix brown sugar and melted butter, divide among prepared cups. Quarter each pineapple slice; place one piece in each cup.

For cakes, cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy, beat in egg and vanilla. In another bowl, whisk together flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt; add to creamed mixture alternately with yogurt and milk, beating well after each addition. Fill prepared cups two-thirds full. Bake until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean, 12-15 minutes. Cool in pan 2 minutes; invert onto a serving plate.

Serve warm or at room temperature.

Suggestions: One reviewer said it's a very good recipe. I made this in mini pans as I wanted them small for a brunch. I used canned "tidbit" pineapple and saved a step of ccutting pieces small enough to fit smaller pan. I also cut up several maraschino cherries and put a couple of pieces in each cup. It gave them a nice pop of color on the serving tray.....and was glad I had decided to try it out.
