The **Honolulu Orchid Society's** first Orchid Judging of 2021 was conducted at the Lanakila Senior Center on Saturday, August 21. Sixteen plants were brought in and registered for judging. All the plants were screened and five were judged and received awards by the Judging Team. The awarded plants are shown on the next page.

The next HOS Judging Session will be held on Saturday, September 18, 2021 at the Lanakila Senior Center. Members and guests are encouraged to bring their orchid plants for judging. You do not need to be a member of HOS to have your plants judged.

Everyone entering the Lanakila Senior Center MUST WEAR A MASK and KEEP SOCIAL DISTANCE. There is a maximum limit of 10 people that can be in the room at one time. 

ORCHID TIP OF THE MONTH BY SCOT MITAMURA

Last month we talked about the importance of watering your orchids. This month I would like to talk about a second important point about your orchid cultural triangle.

It is air circulation.

So important, often overlooked, and often confused with other ailments. Most commonly when we have sunburn on our orchid leaves, we normally assume that it is from too intense sunlight, but the reality is heat stress.

Sunlight intensity can vary, in higher altitudes, where temperatures are cooler, you will be able to grow your orchids in much brighter to even full sunlight, but in lower elevation where it is warmer the big determining factor is air circulation. With the cooling effect of good air circulation, you will be able to provide your orchids much more sunlight, equaling to much better growth and flowering. In a glass greenhouse during the summer, failure of a circulation fan, can lead to disastrous symptoms of sunburning or actuality heat stress.

Many folks make the common mistake of adding another layer of shade, cutting down their photosynthesis and orchid growth. Instead, they need to lighten the shade density on the sides of their greenhouses and remove shrubbery or other air blockages for added air flow, with the addition of fans.

Other benefits of good air circulation are less fungal diseases and insect pests. We all notice that when it is windy our orchids dry at a much faster rate, so we need to water more often. This is why it is part of the cultural triangle. Orchids like moisture, but they do not like to stay wet, or we will get chronic fungal infections.

It is the same with insect or spider mite infestations, it is always in the space of our growing area that has poor air circulation. One of the best ways to minimize your use of pesticides is to increase your air circulation.

So, in conclusion, good air circulation is an unacknowledged key to growing good orchids in Hawaii, and we must all try to maximize it for our future success.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Bahn Mi (Vietnamese Sandwich)

(Flavors of Aloha Hawaii's Ethnic Foods, Japanese Women's Society of Honolulu 2001)

Ingredients:

- 4 French rolls or croissants, sliced in half lengthwise
- 1 cup cooked chicken, turkey, ham or pork, shredded
- 2 small carrots, cut into julienne
- 1 turnip, cut into julienne
- 1 small cucumber, sliced
- 1 small sweet onion, thinly sliced
- 1 small bunch cilantro

Mayonnaise, optional

Hot garlic-chili pepper sauce, optional

Marinade:

- 1/3 cup rice vinegar
- 1/3 cup lime juice
- 6 tablespoons sugar
- 1 ½ teaspoons nuoc mam (fish sauce)
- 1 clove garlic, pressed or minced



Directions:

Combine marinade ingredients; mix well and marinate carrots and turnips for 4-5 hours. Drain well; set aside.

Spread rolls with mayonnaise, if desired. Fill with shredded meat of your choice then layer with marinated vegetables, slices of cucumber, onion and with a generous amount of cilantro. Add a splash of hot garlic-chili sauce, if desired.

Yield: 4 sandwiches
