#### Honohono Workshop A Big Hit

A hands-on potting workshop was held prior to the May General Membership Meeting. More than 35 people attended the workshop which started promptly at 5:30 pm and ended an hour later. The instructors were **Melvin Waki** and **Calvin Kumano** with assistance from **Jan Takamiya, Walter Hiraishi** and **Brad Lau**. Instructions were given on the *"Kumano*

the old stems. The cut stems were then placed on fine Orchiata bark in 4-inch plastic pots. If water and shade are provided, each cut stem should produce a keiki; some maybe two.

The workshop concluded with participants planting honohono keikis donated by Calvin Kumano and H&R Nurseries. The keikis were planted with New Zealand sphagnum moss in 2-1/4 inch plastic pots. Dolomite and nutricote were added and labels were written to identify the honohono hybrids.

## Aiea Orchid Show

The Aiea Orchid Show will be held on Friday, June 9 and Saturday, June 10 at the Aiea Elementary School Cafeteria. The Honolulu Orchid Society will be putting up a floor display at the Show. Members should be grooming their plants and greeneries to put in the display. The theme of the display is "The Chinese Zodiac Year of the Rabbit". Prop ideas include Rabbits (stuffed animals, toys, figurines, etc.), Chinese decorations, Chinese lanterns, etc., to enhance the display with our theme. Setup for the HOS display will be on Thursday. June 8 beginning at 9:00 am. Let's all work together to make this a great display.

Please stake your plants and if you need to, please place them in a larger pot so the plants can stand alone without falling over when placed in the display.



Please bring your plants, greeneries including hinahina, and props by 11:00 am on Thursday to give the Set-up Committee ample time to complete the display before 3:00 pm. Register your blooming orchid plants with the Show Registration Desk before leaving your plants with the HOS Set-up Committee. Label your plants and props with your name so they are returned to you at breakdown. The Set-up Committee can use your help if you are free that day and at breakdown (4:00 pm) on Saturday. **Miniature Orchid Plant Display Table at the Aiea Orchid Show**. All plants displayed on this table will be considered for the miniature awards. Natural height of plant from the base to the top of the plant (excluding flowers above the leaves) must not exceed 7 inches and the natural width of the leaf span must not exceed 7 inches. Exhibitors must specify at the time of registration that the plant is to be entered in the miniature display.

#### **General Information about HOS Judging**

HOS Judging is usually conducted on the second Saturday of each month at the Lanakila Senior Center and on the fourth Monday of each month at the Aiea Orchid Club meeting at Aiea Elementary School. There will be no judging at the Lanakila Senior Center on June 10, 2023. Judging will instead be conducted at the Aiea Orchid Show.

Anyone can bring flowering orchid plants for judging. You do not have to be a member of HOS to have your plant judged. Plants judged at the Lanakila Senior Center must be dropped off between 9:30 AM and 10:00 AM. Plants judged at Aiea must be brought to the meeting between 6:45 PM and 7:15 PM. Plants that are awarded are assessed a \$25 processing fee. In return the plant owners receive a certificate and a color photo of the flowers.

## **<u>Recipe of the Month</u>**

## **Strawberry Simple Syrup**

Strawberry Simple Syrup is easy to make with just 3 ingredients and it can be used in so many ways!

Course: Condiment, Drinks Cuisine: American Servings: 24 tablespoons Calories: 76kcal

#### **Ingredients**

- 2 lbs fresh strawberries
- 4 cups water
- 2 cups sugar

#### **Instructions**

- 1. Wash the berries and remove stems. Roughly chop or quarter the strawberries and place them into a medium saucepan. Cover with the water and bring to a boil.
- 2. Reduce to a simmer and cook the berries for 20 minutes. Carefully skim and discard any foam that rises to the top.
- 3. After 20 minutes, the berries will be much lighter in color and the water should be a dark pink or red. Place a fine mesh strainer over a second saucepan and pour the strawberry liquid through it.
- 4. Resist the temptation to press down on the cooked berries to extract more juice. This will make the syrup cloudy. After straining, discard the cooked berries.



- 5. Add the sugar to the liquid and bring it back to a boil. Stir constantly, until the sugar has dissolved completely. \*Skim and discard any foam that rises to the top.
- 6. Remove from the heat and let the syrup cool completely before transferring to glass jars for storage in the refrigerator. The syrup will last for several weeks.

\* If you want a thicker syrup for a topping on pancakes, ice cream or other desserts, simmer the syrup for 5-10 minutes longer until the liquid reduces and thickens further.
