HONOLULU ORCHID SOCIETY (HOS) NOVEMBER GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

Date: Wednesday, November 8, 2023 <u>Time/Place</u>: 7:00 PM, Lanakila Elementary School Cafeteria <u>Program</u>: "Orchid Judging 101" <u>Speaker</u>: Robert Moffitt

Robert Moffitt, an Accredited Judge with the Honolulu Orchid Society (HOS) and American Orchid Society, will cover the HOS judging system including trophy and merit judging; the merit point scoring system; categories of judges (student, accredited, etc.); how long it takes to reach those levels; and what judges look for when awarding orchids.

At the end of the presentation, those in the audience will get an opportunity to judge an orchid plant using the judging guidelines presented by **Moffitt** and scoring sheets used by the judges.

Members are encouraged to bring their blooming orchid plants for the Plant Culture Table. As in past in-person meetings, people in attendance will be given an opportunity to select the best plants in the **Novice Category** (up to 4 years growing orchids) and the **Masters Category** (more than 4 years growing orchids). Voting for the best will be based on flower appearance, fragrance, uniqueness or overall plant growth. Prizes will be given to the two top vote-getters in each category.

The **Mini Country Store** will be closed. The Country Store workers are still recuperating from the very busy and successful country store sales at the 2023 Honolulu Orchid Society Orchid Show.

The popular Refreshment Table will be open. Anyone wishing to share any goodies may bring them to the meeting.

Recipe of the Month

Pecan Coffee Cake

My mom serves this nutty coffee cake for Christmas breakfast each year. The simple recipe is a big timesaver on such an event-filled morning. Everyone loves the crunchy topping. —Becky Wax, Tuscola, Illinois

Prep Time: 15 minutes Bake Time: 30 minutes Servings: 15

Ingredients

- 1 package yellow cake mix (regular size)
- 1 package (3.4 ounces) instant vanilla pudding mix
- 1 cup sour cream
- 4 large eggs, room temperature
- 1/3 cup canola oil
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 2/3 cup chopped pecans
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1/2 cup confectioners' sugar
- 2 tablespoons orange juice

Instructions

1. In a large bowl, beat the first 6 ingredients on low speed for 30 seconds. Beat on medium for 2

minutes. Pour into a greased 13x9-inch baking pan. Combine pecans, sugar and cinnamon, sprinkle over batter. Cut through batter with a knife to swirl pecan mixture.

2. Bake at 350° for 30-35 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean.

3. Meanwhile, in a small bowl, combine confectioners' sugar and orange juice until smooth, drizzle over warm coffee cake. Cool on a wire rack.

<u>Nutrition Facts</u>: 1 piece: 335 calories, 16g fat (4g saturated fat), 67mg cholesterol, 332mg sodium, 44g carbohydrate (29g sugars, 1g fiber), 4g protein.

Today, we don't have the companies to do this, but we can all simply apply the same theory. Just go ahead and treat yourself to a blooming orchid whenever you don't have anything in bloom. You can also target orchid show dates and purchase flowering orchids at the shows, building your inventory for orchids that bloom at show times. You also need to always update your collection. Orchids get old, diseased and eventually die. I'm sure that we all have some orchids that don't grow or flower well for our conditions, or sometimes you may even get tired of it. Simply give it away to a new member who would greatly appreciate it, and buy something new.

On November 1st, we have a great opportunity to acquire some new orchids at our annual fund-raising Auction Night! Spread the word about this great event, that is open to everyone. We will have many silent bid items, baked goods and supplies, and open bid items. The club is working hard to put together a nice array of rare and unusual orchids that would surely please everyone.
