Born in Borneo, **Dr. Ee** was raised around orchids his entire life by his grandmother and mother, both of whom treasured local orchids. They taught **Dr. Ee** how to grow and flower them at a young age, and he never looked back since. **Dr. Ee** has since grown many varieties over 30 years, but his favorites are Cattleya species, Paphiopedilum species, novelty Phalaenopsis, and miniatures, with a few botanical varieties thrown in. At present **Dr. Ee** has over 500 plants, a majority of them selected and heirloom Cattleya species, and three orchid

tanks, including a cool tank with Dendrobium cuthbersoniis. **Dr. Ee** has travelled the world to attend orchid shows and nurseries. He is an American Orchid Society Associate Judge with the Toronto judging center as well as President of the Canadian Orchid Congress. He is committed to the sharing of orchid knowledge and conservation efforts of local orchids around the world. Please welcome **Dr. Ee** at Wednesday's meeting.

The **Plant Culture Table** will be open for the July meeting. Members are encouraged to bring their blooming orchids to the meeting to share with the audience. Ewa Orchid Show & Plant Sale

The Ewa Orchid Show is returning after a 5 year hiatus. The Show will be on Friday, July 18 and Saturday, July 19 at the Ewa Elementary School Cafeteria. The Ewa Orchid Society President, Matthew McKnight III is the Show Chairman. The Show theme is "Forever Orchids"

The Honolulu Orchid Society will be putting up a 10' x 10' floor display at the Show. Adam Almeida has volunteered to be in charge of the display. The display set-up will be on Thursday, July 17, from 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM. Membership support is really needed to create a great display. Blooming orchid plants, greens, ferns, hina hina and natural items like driftwood and river rocks will be needed. For plants that cannot stand alone, place them in a larger pot so they will not fall over when placed in the display. Label your plants and props with your name so they are returned to you at breakdown.

Miniature Orchid Plants will be incorporated into the floor display as there will not be a separate Miniature Display Table at the Ewa Orchid Show.

Recipe of the Month

Custard Peach Pie

Custard Peach Pie is sweet, creamy, and oh so delicious! We make it with creamy custard, fresh or canned peaches, and top it with crumb topping.

Prep Time: 15 minutes **Cook Time**: 60 minutes **Servings**: 8

Ingredients

Pie

- 1 store bought Pie Crust
- 3 Egg Yolks
- 2 containers, 6 oz Peach Yogurt
- 3/4 cup Sugar
- 1/4 cup Flour
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 2 1/2 cans, 15 oz Peach slices, drained

Topping

- 6 tbsp Butter
- 1/2 cup Flour
- 1/4 cup Brown Sugar

Instructions

- Preheat oven to 425.
- Pierce pie crust several times with a fork and prebake for 5-10 minutes.
- Beat egg yolks in a medium bowl until blended.7
- Add yogurt, sugar, vanilla and flour. Beat until smooth. Set aside.
- Pat peach slices dry and place in bottom of pie crust.
- Pour custard mixture over peach slices.
- Bake pie for 20 minutes.
- Remove from oven and cover crust with aluminum foil.
- Bake for another 15 minutes.
- In a small bowl combine topping ingredients and blend with pastry cutter or 2 forks.
- Evenly sprinkle the streusel over the top of the pie.
- Bake for 20 more minutes or until the custard is only slightly jiggly.
- Allow to cool before cutting.

Orchid Tip of the Month by Scot Mitamura

July brings us into our long summer months. This is a critical time for our orchids to grow and store energy for flowering. I am always talking about how important it is to water, but many beginners do not understand how and why it is important to water properly. In Hawaii we are very lucky to have a good water source (except in some areas of the Big Island due to the volcano). Yes, the sodium levels in our water over the years have been rising, but not to overly severe levels. Many growers are turning to Reverse Osmosis to purify their water. I feel that it is a nice to have item, but not a need to have item. If you want to grow orchids successfully, it is of utmost importance to understand how to water. Understand that irrigation systems saves time and benefits the nursery owner and I will use mine on occasion, but my orchids do much better when it rains or when I can water them heavily by hand. I like to water with high volume from all sides of the orchid, especially wetting the undersides of the leaves. I have eliminated any Spider Mite problems that I have experienced and I am minimizing my other insect pests as well as hard water stains (waterspotting). Most of the epiphytic orchids that we commonly grow, naturally hang in trees, this mimics how the plants are wet in nature. My irrigation system, even run for fifteen minutes, does not fully wet the undersides of my orchids. When I hand water I also water the same plant multiple times. If you have ever grown an orchid in a clear pot, you will have seen that even after multiple heavy watering, the whole root ball is still not wet. We want the water to run out of the bottom drainage holes. This helps in minimizing accumulated salts that will kill your roots over time. This is especially important if you are fertilizing regularly because fertilizers are in a form of a soluble salt. Frequency of watering depends on day-length, cloudiness, air circulation, type of media, and type of pots. For epiphytic orchids, let them begin to dry before watering again. Terrestrial orchids generally like to be kept evenly moist. Mounted or hanging orchids normally could be watered every day. So there are many factors that go into deciding if you are going to water your orchids. My advice is to check them daily. This gives you a chance to bond with your orchids. As I am watering, or checking if I need to water, I am looking for orchids coming into flower so I can stake them. I can also see any orchid that has fallen down, or one that has weeds, or one that has insect, or slug damage. How about ones that need fertilizer or need to be re-potted. The list goes on and on. As you can see, I feel it is really important, because you are doing much more than just watering. Without this understanding, one will always struggle to take their orchid collection to the next level. Aloha, Scot
